2	Tool slipping when bleeding used	The Group & Leaders	Tool maintenance keeps bow saw sharp and useable. Glove worn on the non-sawing hand.	3	4	12	To ensure group have a full understanding on how to position the tool correctly when using it, so if a slip occurs, it will not make contact with them or any member of the group.	Forest School Leaders
3	Bow saw blade snapping	The Group & Leaders	Regular and effective maintenance of tools. Glove worn on the non-sawing hand.	2	3	6	The group will be informed of how a blade should look and that if a problem has occurred with a tool it should be reported immediately to the leader. The leader will decommission the tool.	Forest School Leaders
4	Bow saw trapping hand	The Group & Leaders	Hand guards on tools. Glove worn on the non-sawing hand.	3	2	6	Correct positioning of saw when in use.	Forest School Leaders

**RATING-** The **probability** multiplied by the **severity** gives a figure from 1 to 25. Any hazard scoring above **12** will need to have immediate additional control measures put in place to prevent a serious incident.
