

# What Parents & Educators Need to Know about ONLINE TROLLING



B00!

The term "Trolling" refers to sending hurtful or provocative comments – often done anonymously online – to provoke a reaction or cause emotional distress. Anonymity can embolden people into saying things they wouldn't dare say in person. Euro 2024 and other tournaments tend to put an emphasis on this, with the abuse of both players and fans often increasing during such events.

#### ESCALATION

ny trolls begin with silly, band comments one moving on to a broader pattern of insive messages and posts. They can also um their attention very quickly to a new target I they grow bored with an existing one, which makes engaging with one fruitless at best – and ntially dangerous at worst.

#### HIDING BEHIND A SCREEN

Because trails tend to use ananymous profiles, they enjoy a lack of accountability. This also means they'll often have multiple profiles, potentially switching between them arguitarly or posting across several of them at the same time, making a larget feel as though there's no escope. After all, once you block one account, what's to stop them reappearing elsewhere?

..... 24/7 CONTACT

The internet has given us the ability to remain in contact at any time, from almost anywhere in the world. A troll having the ability to reach you wherever they want can leave you feeling like their obuse is unavoidable. While they don't see you in real life, they can message you at any time, reach suit to your peers online and even by the observed in forest aniles and even by discover your personal information to scare

### HATE SPEECH

Sodly, many trolls report to spewing racial slun homophobic attacks and awful storeotypes, or these aften stand the best chance of causing emplored harm. After burg 2026, three England footballers were racially abused, resulting in several prison sentences.

### IMPACT ON VICTIMS

It's not uncommon for the victims of trails to thut down their accounts, disappear from public life, and try to stay out of the crosshain for a time – with some even leaving social dia torever. This can have a severe impact on children on young people's connections to triends and the world at large, and may not ever actually stop the trail. The victims' families, for example, may have online profiles that trails can still access.
