- What does the term dual sensory loss or deafblind mean?
Someone would be considered to be deafblind or have a dual sensory loss if their combined hearing and sight loss causes them difficulty with communication, access to information and mobility
- Whats the difference between deafblind and dual sensory?
Deafblind usually refers to someone who is congenitally (born) deafblind. Dual Sensory Loss usually refers to someone who has acquired hearing and sight loss in later life
- Does someone have to be totally deaf and totally blind to be considered deafblind?
No, the majority of people with a dual sensory loss have some useful vision and some useful hearing - it is the combination which causes the difficulty
- Is the Braille the only way that people who are deafblinding can communicate?
No. There are many ways in which someone who is deafblind can learn to communicate - objects of reference, adapted sign language, computerised methods etc
- Does a white cane with red bands mean anything special?
Yes. It means that the person using the cane has a hearing loss in addition to a sight loss
